Supercharge Your Pocket PC: Tools and Utilities



The Pocket PC is a marvelous device that can help you organize your life and work, entertain yourself, and stay in touch with the world around you. It can also be an enormous annoyance when the imperfect operating system either lacks what you need or becomes a new definition for the word *inconvenience*. But by downloading some utilities, you can add these solid capabilities to a Pocket PC:

- ◆ Easily close and manage programs.
- ♦ Have system performance statistics at your fingertips.
- ◆ Customize your Today screen.
- ◆ Add powerful handwriting recognition.
- ◆ Make a powerful calculator available.
- ◆ Add a keyboard to your Pocket PC.
- ◆ Turn your Pocket PC into a stopwatch and add a full-screen monthly calendar.
- ◆ Add real file exploration to your Pocket PC.
- ◆ Use zip-compatible archives.
- ◆ Add spell checking to your device.


This part presents powerful utilities for using your Pocket PC with less pain and more pleasure.

Get Programs off Your Screen at the Tap of a Stylus


If you have used a Pocket PC for more than five minutes, you probably know that stuck feeling when the computer runs out of memory and you need to close one program before using another. If only stopping an application were as easy as with Windows on your PC, where you click a box


with an *X*, or pick Exit from the File menu. Instead, you have to perform the following sequence of actions:

- **1.** Choose Settings from the Start menu.
- **2.** Tap the System tab at the bottom of the screen.









5. Either tap the application you want to stop and tap the Stop button, or tap the Stop All button to stop all running programs.







How annoying! Sometimes you can bring up the keyboard and then tap first the Ctrl key and then the *Q* key to close an application, but it depends on the program and you don't know ahead of time. However, there is a better way to handle programs. Instead of feeling as though you have to pass through every possible menu to close an application, with the utility TaskPro Navigator or TaskMaster you can easily choose to close the active program, all programs but the active program, or all programs.

TaskPro Navigator




TaskPro Navigator is a shareware application that makes managing programs on your Pocket PC easier. Follow the next few steps to install TaskPro Navigator:

1. Copy the file at Section01\TaskProNav\Devonetask.exe to your hard drive from the CD accompanying this book.



NOTE TaskPro Navigator should work with any Pocket PC on the market because it is compatible with StrongARM, MIPS, and SH3 processors. Unlike Microsoft Windows, which runs on computers with Pentium-compatible processors (the chips that actually do the computing), Pocket PCs vary in the types of processors they use. Although not a hard and fast rule, Casio models use MIPS, Hewlett-Packard Pocket PCs use SH3, and Compaq uses the StrongARM chip.

2. Open Windows Explorer, find the file location on your hard drive, and double-click the file. You will see an installation screen.






3. Click Next six times.



NOTE This assumes that you install the software in the suggested folder—a step I would *strongly* recommend. To throw caution to the wind, follow the onscreen instructions for specifying a different folder.

- 4. The installation program will say, "On the next mobile device connection, the installed applications will be downloaded to the device." Click OK.
- **5.** You can choose to receive marketing information by filling out the Register Your Trial Version Today screen and clicking Next. For this discussion, we will click Skip.





6. Click Finish.



NOTE You will need the Adobe Acrobat Reader to read the TaskPro Navigator User's Guide. A copy is on the CD accompanying this book.

- **7.** Place your Pocket PC in its cradle and synchronize it to your desktop PC.
- **8.** Tap Yes at the "Install 'Developer One, Inc. TaskPro Navigator' using the default application install directory" prompt on the PC. Then tap OK to clear the installation screen.
- **9.** Remove the Pocket PC from its cradle and tap the OK button at the top of the installation screen.





- **10.** To have TaskPro Navigator always available, tap Yes on the dialog box that asks if you want a shortcut on the Start menu. You can always remove it later.
- **11.** Tap OK.

The program is now installed and you are ready to begin using it. You can either turn the Pocket PC off and restart it so the utility will initialize or, if you chose not to have a shortcut in the Startup folder, do the following:

- **1.** Open the Start menu.
- 2. Select Programs.
- **3.** Scroll down the screen until you reach the TaskPro Navigator icon. Tap it.



The TaskPro Navigator icon appears at the top of your screen. To use the utility, follow these steps:

1. Locate the TaskPro Navigator icon in the center of the screen. Tap the right arrow to open TaskPro Navigator.



2. Tap the appropriate menu choice to close the currently active application, to close all applications but the current one, or to close all the applications.



3. Choose Exit TaskPro to close the utility.

You can now close applications quickly at your convenience. Notice that there is one menu option for TaskPro Navigator that we did not discuss. It

provides additional capabilities covered in the next section, "Have Pocket PC System Performance Statistics at Your Fingertips."

Free Task Switching with TaskMaster 2



TaskPro Navigator is *shareware*, software that you can try before purchasing. Although TaskPro Navigator is certainly worth the few dollars it costs, if you're feeling particularly parsimonious you can try another program, TaskMaster 2. Follow these steps to install it:

- 1. Copy the file at Section01\TaskMaster\Taskmast.zip to your hard drive from the CD accompanying this book. Unarchive the file using WinZip or a similar archive utility. The file will create a subdirectory called taskmast ce00019d.
- **2.** Double-click the folder and then double-click the installation file setup. exe. Click OK.
- **3.** The next time you synchronize your Pocket PC, you will see a dialog box that says, "Install 'TrueDimensions TaskMaster' using the default application install directory?" Click Yes, then click OK.

The application is now ready to use; just follow these steps:

1. Tap the TaskMaster Start icon at the top-left corner of the Pocket PC screen.




2. Notice the drop-down TaskMaster menu. There are four sections. The top section shows the applications that are running, with the currently active application at the top of the list. Tap any of the application icons to bring that program to the screen.



3. The next section is the Today section; tap it and you go to the Today screen.



- **4.** In the third section, you can close applications. You can close the currently active application, all applications but the currently active one, or all applications.
- **5.** The fourth section of the TaskMaster menu is the Options section. By choosing Options, you can change the way the program operates. Tap the Triggers tab.



6. You can change the way the user interface works. For example, you can customize the interface so that when you tap the TaskMaster

icon, all the applications close. To do this, tap the TaskMaster icon and then Options. Tap the box next to Single Tap, highlight Close All, and then tap OK.

7. You can adjust the TaskMaster menu to your liking, too. Tap Task-Master icon ➤ Options ➤ Menu tab. From this tab, you can specify the items that appear on the TaskMaster menu other than the listing of programs. To navigate through the Menu field, tap the arrows under the Menu box to highlight an item, then tap Remove. The item will move to the Commands box. To add something from the Commands box to the Menu box, tap the selection to highlight it, then tap Add. Tap OK when you are done.



The Triggers tab of the Options section is also useful for understanding what shortcuts exist in the product. Look at one of the actions, and the box to the right explains the shortcuts that are available. For example, tap and hold the stylus on the TaskMaster icon and then drag the stylus to the right and your Pocket PC will switch to the next running application. Have fun!

2 Have Pocket PC System Performance Statistics at Your Fingertips

Because the Pocket PC has to fit in your pocket—otherwise a less eponymous name would be needed—there is less room for memory and storage. You could keep popping CompactFlash cards in and out for more memory, but it's best to watch the system resources and anticipate when you might run short of memory—or power, for that matter.



NOTE CompactFlash cards are small blocks with large amounts of memory. By sliding the CompactFlash card into the appropriate slot of the Pocket PC, you can increase the amount of available memory. When memory is short, you can install programs onto CompactFlash cards instead of onto the Pocket PC's main memory.

For directions on installing TaskPro Navigator, see number 1, "Get Programs off Your Screen at the Tap of a Stylus."

Get System Statistics

You can see system resource monitors in one place. Follow these steps to see how it's done:

1. Tap the TaskPro Navigator icon at the top of the screen.






2. Select the TaskPro Options menu choice.



3. The screen now shows memory and storage statistics, as well as information on battery life.



You can use this information to better plan your Pocket PC use. For example, this display can tell you when an application might run out of memory or when the entire Pocket PC could run out of power. Be aware, though, that gauges are approximate. The technical editor of this book often hears people complain, "The Pocket PC said that I had 3% of my battery power remaining!" Well, I can understand why they get upset. After all, it's not as though they waited until the last second...or, then again, maybe they did. When you are done with the statistics, tap the OK button at the top of the screen to clear the display.

3 Customize Your Today Screen



There are some applications that may not do anything useful, per se, but are good for personal aesthetics. The programs described here are options more for flash than function. Microsoft Today Screen Image lets you incorporate an image in your Pocket PC's Today screen and even launch an application by tapping the image, and Color Picker lets you change the color scheme on the Pocket PC.

Microsoft Today Screen Image

First, let's start by installing Microsoft Today Screen Image, using these instructions:

- Download the file to your hard drive from the link in the Links\MS Image folder on the CD accompanying this book. Double-click the new copy.
- 2. Click Next twice.
- **3.** Click OK. The application will load to your Pocket PC the next time you synchronize.

Select the .bmp image you want to use. There are many images available on the Web. If you find an image in another format, such as a .jpg or .gif, you can convert it to a .bmp with any good Windows image editor.

Using Microsoft Today Screen Image is about as easy as installing it:

- **1.** Download a .bmp image file to your Pocket PC.
- **2.** Go to the Today screen on your Pocket PC and tap the Today banner.



3. Highlight the Image check box and tap the Options button.





4. By adding the .bmp's file path into the Image Path text box, the image will appear on the Today screen. Tap Browse to find and highlight the image.



5. If you tap the New Image Item button, you can place another image below the first.



WARNING While you can easily add additional images, getting rid of them is an entirely different experience. There seems to be no way to remove additional image listings; you have to settle for unselecting them in the Today setup screen. My attempts to uninstall the software resulted in repeated messages about some program file that refused to cooperate. Cleaning the slate required a full device reset, followed by a complete resynchronization. It's best to remove .bmp relics because they are some of the largest image files that can be found.



6. Add the file path of an application in the Run This When Tapped box, and you can launch that program by tapping the image on the Today screen. Unfortunately, there is no Browse function in this case; you do need to enter the correct path yourself.

Add Flash with ColorPicker




Now that you have added the Pocket PC equivalent of PC wallpaper, you might decide to change some other colors to keep your screen coordinated. That's where ColorPicker comes in. To use this application, follow these steps:

- **1.** Copy the file at Section01\ColorPicker\ColorPicker.exe to your hard drive from the CD accompanying this book.
- **2.** Tap Next, Yes, and then tap Next again.
- **3.** Tap OK and then tap Finish.
- **4.** Resynchronize your Pocket PC to your desktop. When prompted to install ColorPicker, click Yes.

Now ColorPicker is installed. To open the program, follow these steps:

- **1.** Tap the Start menu.
- **2.** Tap the ColorPicker icon.




3. You have two choices in how to change colors on your device. One is to adjust the shade for specific items—such as menu backgrounds, text color in dialog boxes, or the borders of controls—by tapping the drop-down box and highlighting the item in question. You can go to step 9 if you want to let someone else do most of the work.






NOTE Even the best-laid plans of programmers and men go oft astray. The program's author labeled some items as "Unknown" because, although their color can be altered, their identities remain unknown. If you manage to remove a mask and identify one, be kind and send a note to the e-mail address provided in the software.

4. Tap the Change button.





5. You can specify the color through the proper color formula, which is the combination of red, green, and blue levels that make the shade in question. Each level can take a value from 0 to 255, inclusive. Once you've filled in the values for red, green, and blue, tap Set. If you aren't a graphics designer, tap Select Color instead and tap a color on the screen that will go well with the color of your eyes, then tap OK at the top of the screen.




6. Tap Set. You can go through and change other items as you wish. When you are finally done, tap Exit.


7. Enter a name for your color scheme, then tap OK.



8. You are now prompted to decide whether to update the registry with your changes. If you typically pair stripes with checks in your daily wardrobe, tap No. Otherwise, tap Yes to actually use the new colors on your Today screen.



9. To trust someone else's taste, you could tap the ColorPicker icon and then the Select a Scheme button. Pick one of the included color schemes from the drop-down list and then tap OK. Tap Exit and then OK to use the new color scheme.





Between Microsoft Today Screen Image and ColorPicker, you can make your Pocket PC look the way you want. These programs show that art and technology can live in harmony, more or less.

4 Add Powerful Handwriting Recognition



Those tired of choosing between the tiny on-screen keyboard and the Pocket PC's Character Recognizer might want to try Microsoft Transcriber.



NOTE The Character Recognizer is an operating system feature. You write characters one at a time and the Character Recognizer interprets the stylus movements and adds the equivalent digital text characters.

With Microsoft Transcriber, you can combine printing, writing in script, and making gestures on the screen as you wish, and your device can understand them. Be aware, though, that no handwriting recognition is completely accurate, so you might need to rewrite some items. And the

software is freeware, so you can keep your wallet in your pocket. Follow these steps to install the software:

- **1.** Download the file tranScriberCE_e.exe to your hard drive from the link provided on the CD accompanying this book.
- **2.** Double-click the file, then click Continue.
- **3.** Click Next and then Yes. You must type something in the Company box (blanks don't work). Click Next four times, then click OK. Click Finish.
- **4.** The software will install onto your Pocket PC the next time you synchronize the device with your desktop PC. Click Yes, and then click OK when the installation is finished.

Run Microsoft Transcriber

Next, you must prepare the Pocket PC to work with the program. Tap the OK button on the dialog box instructing you to return all programs to list view. Afterward, reset the device according to the vendor's instructions.

 Close all running programs and reset the device according to the manufacturer's instructions.




WARNING Do not perform a complete device reset, which would erase the device's memory and force you to reload Microsoft Transcriber (and any other downloaded programs).

2. Transcriber is now an available choice as are the keyboard and character recognition functions. To experiment with Transcriber, start Pocket Word by clicking its icon in Start ➤ Programs.






3. Tap the arrow in the lower-right corner and select Transcriber.



4. The dialog box that appears gives the basics of using Transcriber. You can write anywhere on the screen and mix cursive and printing as you wish. The system also recognizes numbers and symbols, as well as a few gestures for enter, space, backspace, and correcting a mistake.





NOTE It doesn't matter where you write on the screen, but try to avoid leaning your hand on the screen, which will seem like an attempt at writing gibberish.

5. Trying the new system is the best way to learn it. As you write, or scrawl as some of us do, the system will translate the script into type.





NOTE If you make a mistake, you can highlight the problematic material and write the correct text to replace it.



Handwriting recognition is unlikely to be any more perfect than your own handwriting, and possibly a good deal better. But the trick in effectively employing Transcriber is to know when best to use it. If absolute character fidelity is important, use character recognition or the keyboard. When speed is most important, and you can clean up the results later, have at the task with Transcriber.

5 Make a Powerful Calculator Available



If you need to perform simple arithmetic, the calculator that comes with the Pocket PC is adequate. Get more demanding in your use and you will need a more powerful tool. That would be the shareware CoolCalc. To install CoolCalc, follow these steps:

- 1. Copy the file CoolCalc.exe to your hard drive from the SectionO1\
 CoolCalc folder on the CD accompanying this book.
- **2.** Double-click the file.
- **3.** In turn, click Next, Accept, Next, Install, OK, and then Finish.
- **4.** Synchronize the Pocket PC with your desktop to install the software on your device. When you see the dialog box on the PC asking to install CoolCalc, click Yes and then OK.

Use CoolCalc

Launching the calculator is similarly easy:


1. Tap Start > Programs and tap the CoolCalc icon.



2. You will see a registration screen. For now, tap Skip.




3. What you see on the screen may not seem that much more impressive than the calculator that comes with the Pocket PC, but this is the program's basic calculator function.





4. To see what else is available, tap the Go menu at the bottom of the screen.





NOTE Some may find the term RPN in calculator choices unfamiliar. It stands for *Reverse Polish Notation*, a way of stating problems where numbers are keyed in before the operation (such as addition or division) is specified.

You have a choice of calculators that can handle a wide range of problems from scientific to date functions. For example, you can find the difference between two dates. You can even calculate loan rates, or tips when you are

out for the evening. You can also write macros for the calculator. For more information on its capabilities, tap File and select the Help option for instructions.

6 Add a Keyboard to Your Pocket PC

If you long to ignore the text entry choices on the Pocket PC and to use a keyboard instead, why not add one? There are a number of manufacturers that make keyboards for your device. One I have tried is the Stowaway keyboard from Targus (www.targus.com), which is available for the HP Jornada or the Compaq iPaq.



Because keyboards from different vendors vary in design, you should follow their provided instructions on installation and use. Just be sure to choose one that folds for compact storage; the Stowaway collapses into a package about the size of the Pocket PC itself.

TURN YOUR POCKET PC INTO A STOPWATCH AND ADD A FULL-SCREEN MONTHLY CALENDAR





Turn Your Pocket PC into a Stopwatch and Add a Full-Screen Monthly Calendar



Measuring time closely and accurately is often an important element of productivity in sports, cooking, and in a number of other areas in your life. StopTime, which lets a Pocket PC function as a stopwatch, appears in this first part because it's an addition to the operating system that can be useful time and again. In addition to measuring time, it also provides a monthly calculator.

StopTime offers lots of cool features:

- ◆ Track laps or other portions of a process while marking total cumulative time.
- ◆ Run multiple times simultaneously.
- ◆ Count increasing time from zero, or count down from a time you select.
- ◆ Reset timers anytime you wish.
- ◆ View a monthly calendar, then tap a date and go to the matching Pocket PC daily calendar.


Get Started with StopTime

To use all of the great features of StopTime, follow these steps before installing the program on your Pocket PC:

- 1. Copy the file StopTime.exe to your hard drive from the Section01\
 StopTime folder on the CD accompanying this book.
- **2.** Double-click the file.
- 3. Click Next, Yes, and then OK.

StopTime is now ready to install onto your Pocket PC as soon as you synchronize it with your desktop. To install StopTime, follow these steps:

1. Tap the StopTime icon in Start ➤ Programs ➤ Accessories. Tap the S button at the bottom of the screen.



- **2.** Tap Start to start the clock. Tap Lap to display intermediate times. Tap Stop to halt timing; tap Reset to return the time to zero.
- **3.** Tap the T button at the bottom of the screen to display four different counters. By default, each counts backward from five minutes. Anyone who has tried making dinner and clocking various dishes with a single timer will appreciate this feature.





- **4.** Highlight one of the counters and then tap Set to change the initial time on the counter.
- **5.** Tap the C button at the bottom and you get a full-screen calendar.
- **6.** Tap any of the days on the calendar and you launch the Pocket PC's Calendar program for that day.

Now you can schedule your meetings and appointments as you normally would.

8 Add Real File Exploration to Your Pocket PC



The Pocket PC's File Explorer is another feature that, to put it kindly, leaves something to be desired. Okay, so it's awful. But dTree is a program that will give you much of what you might expect on your desktop. Oh, and it's free.

Besides being free, dTree's other nifty features let you do the following:

- ♦ View the files on your Pocket PC in an easy-to-use tree-structured view.
- ◆ Copy, cut, or paste a file from the interface.

- ◆ Beam a file to another device.
- Easily link a program to the Start menu.

You can also create shortcuts and folders and even run programs, play sound files, and open archive files through dTree.

Get Started with dTree

Follow these steps to install dTree:

- **1.** Copy the file IdTree.exe to your hard drive from the Section01\DTree folder on the CD accompanying this book.
- **2.** Double-click the file. You will see a dialog box; click Yes twice, then click OK twice.
- **3.** Synchronize your Pocket PC to your desktop to finish installing dTree.

To use dTree, go to the Programs option of the Start menu and follow these steps:

1. Tap the dTree icon, which looks like a folder surrounded by a dark line. Don't be fooled; it's not a folder.



2. You can now see the contents of your Pocket PC arranged in a tree structure, making navigation easier. The initial view may seem limited, but tap the plus sign next to the folder you want to open.





3. You can reach any file through the interface. The buttons at the bottom of the screen perform different functions, such as copying, cutting, or pasting a file; beaming a file to another device through an infrared connection; and linking a program to the Start menu.

To understand the function of any button, tap and hold the stylus on the button until a label appears, then slide the stylus off the button and lift the stylus off the screen. Tapping the question mark opens a Help file, which lists all of the program's capabilities. Scan through the list and try using the different capabilities after you synchronize the Pocket PC with your desktop. That way, if you make a mistake while experimenting, the synchronization with your PC will ensure that you can restore things to their rightful state with, in the worst case, a full device reset and resynchronization.

9 Use Zip-Compatible Archives



Zip archives are a way of saving storage space on a PC. A zip application like WinZip takes files on your hard drive, compresses them, and stores them in a single file called a .zip. Think of how much more useful archiving

could be on a Pocket PC, where space is at a premium. HandyZIP is a shareware program that lets you do the following:

- ◆ Create and view zip archives.
- ◆ Edit which files are in an archive.
- ◆ Use file encryption to protect sensitive data.

If companies are going to make computers tiny, it seems only fair that you make your files tiny, too.

Install HandyZIP

To install this tool, follow these steps:

- 1. Copy the file HandyZip.exe to your hard drive from the Section01\
 HandyZip folder on the CD accompanying this book.
- **2.** Double-click the file, then click Next.
- **3.** Click Accept, then click Next.
- **4.** Be sure not to click Registered Copy unless you have purchased a license and have received a code from the vendor, CNetX.
- **5.** Click Next three times, then click OK and Finish.
- **6.** Synchronize your Pocket PC to the desktop to complete the installation. When prompted to install the software, click Yes and OK.

Now you are set to start compressing and archiving files on your Pocket PC.

Use HandyZIP

HandyZIP is now available from the Start menu. To use the software, follow these steps:

- **1.** Tap HandyZIP on the Start menu.
- **2.** Tap the I Agree button to use the program.






3. Try selecting the sample file, called Start Here, to view the contents, which just happen to be some instructions. The application proper to the file will automatically start.



4. You can tap the icon of a magnifying glass and folder at the bottom of the screen to switch between a folder and Explorer view.



5. To create a new archive, tap the z icon at the bottom of the screen.



- **6.** Supply a name for the archive in the Name box and choose its folder. You can save the archive in main memory or to a CompactFlash card, if one is available. Tap OK.
- **7.** Open the new archive. Tap Tools ➤ Add Files to begin choosing which files to include in the archive. Tapping Tools ➤ Extract lets you uncompress a file from the archive and save it on the Pocket PC.

For more information on using HandyZIP, open the HZSample.zip archive and tap the Start here! file. You can also tap Help on the Start menu while HandyZIP is running to gain access to HandyZIP context-sensitive help as needed.



NOTE The instructions in the sample zip archive are displayed by Internet Explorer, so be sure to switch back to HandyZIP before trying to run Help.



1 Add Spell Checking to Your Device



Having a pocket-sized computer is no reason not to have a large dictionary available. If you are a bibliophile, a word lover, or just need to look up definitions of words often, HPC Spell is for you. HPC Spell is a shareware program with a spell-checking engine, a 90,000-word English dictionary, and a status bar.

Unlike spell checking on a PC, HPC Spell is a stand-alone application that lets you do the following:

- ◆ Create documents within the program.
- ◆ Open existing text, RTF (rich text format) documents, or Pocket Word files.
- ◆ Spell check a document, make any necessary changes, and then save it.

You can also write something in HPC Spell, then directly send the results as an e-mail—a comforting choice for those who get hives from close proximity to spelling bees.

Install HPC Spell

HPC Spell is easy to install; just follow these steps:

- 1. Copy the file HPCSpell. exe to your hard drive from the Section01\
 HPCSpell folder on the CD accompanying this book.
- **2.** Double-click the file.

- **3.** Click Next, click Yes, then click Next three times. Finally, click OK.
- **4.** Synchronize the Pocket PC with your desktop. Click Yes and then click OK.

HPC Spell is now installed.

Use HPC Spell

You can start and use the program with the following steps:

1. Tap the HPC Spell icon under the Programs option of the Start menu.



- 2. To spell check a file, tap File ➤ Open and pick a file. Tap Spelling ➤ Check Spelling. You can also tap the check icon at the bottom right of the screen.
- **3.** You can search for text by tapping Edit ➤ Find or by tapping the binocular icon at the bottom of the screen.

For more information on how to use the program, tap the Help option in the Start menu while HPC Spell is the current application. That will bring up the context-sensitive help.
